




Have you ever felt that your family game nights have been lacking? Do none of the games you play fulfill your craving for domination in the cut-throat business arena that is Rogers, Arkansas? Well, don't fret.

There is a game out there for you!

Rogersopoly puts a local twist on the all-time favorite game of Monopoly.

Rogersopoly allows up to four people to play at a time. The players can choose from the red, yellow, blue, and green game pieces to represent themselves on the board. Local businesses, like Daisy and the Rogers Chamber of Commerce, take the place of the usual locations that make up the squares on the game board. Rather than going to jail, Rogersopoly has players go to court. This improved version of a much loved game gives players \$300 when they pass start, unlike the original which gave players \$200 for passing "GO!" Like the original, Rogersopoly utilizes brightly colored money to help players facilitate financial exchanges during their turns.

Rogersopoly was a service project sponsored by the Rotary Club of Rogers - Early Risers. Proceeds from the sale of the game benefitted Green Lingle Scholarship Trust and Rogers Scout Hutch. Rogersopoly was produced in 1989 by Pride Distributors, Inc. out of West Bloomfield, Michigan.
