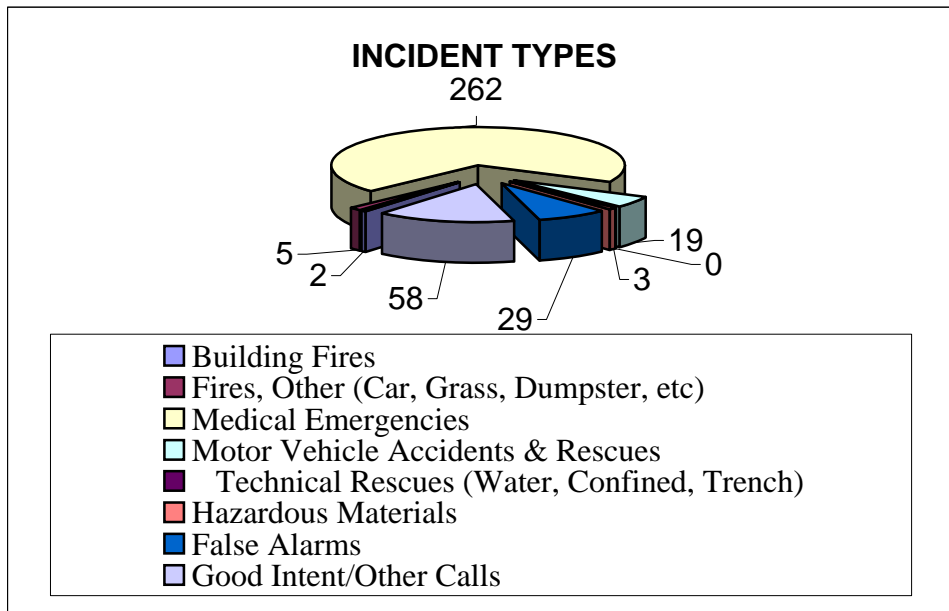

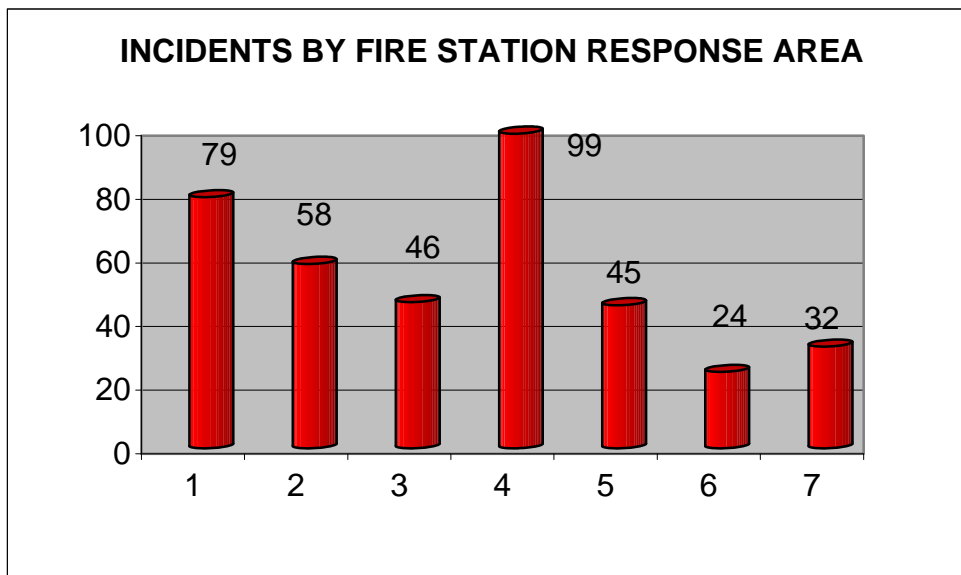

CALLS OF SIGNIFICANT IMPORTANCE

- Nov 1 - 1st alarm building fire in a residential dwelling at 2306 South B Street. Fire contained to room of origin and loss estimated at approximately \$10,000.
- Nov 11 - 1st alarm hazardous materials emergency at PLP Industries, 2740 South 1st Street. High volume gas line rupture inside the structure. Leak was contained without incident.
- Nov 12 - Technical rescue incident at 9631 Grimes Drive in rural Benton County.
- Nov 17 - 1st alarm fire in a heating unit at 300 Innisfree Drive.
- Nov 17 - 1st alarm fire in an electrical vault at the Holiday Inn, 1803 South 52nd Street.
- Nov 17 - Mutual aid fire in a trailer home in rural Benton County, 13269 Elco Lane.
- Nov 18 - Diesel spill in a waterway, with Bentonville Fire Department, near 52nd Street and Medical Center Parkway. Provided technical assistance to BFD.
- Nov 23 - Alert 2, Inbound Aircraft Emergency with landing gear failure at Rogers Municipal Airport. Aircraft landed without incident.
